Dear Mr. Hill:

You have inquired whether one who has been appointed to the position of <u>Town Clerk</u> may also be a magistrate's constable without violating the dual officeholding provisions of the State Constitution.

This Office has long held that a magistrate's constable holds an 'office' within the meaning of the State's dual officeholding provision. Whether or not a town clerk is an officer depends upon the duties of the position as set forth in the town ordinances. We cannot give you an opinion without this information. Yours very truly,
