#### **WELCOME**

The State Task Force is continuing to develop a number of initiatives. We are excited to announce the launch of a new regional task force covering Lexington, Edgefield, McCormick, and Saluda counties. The development of this task force increases regional capacity to respond to human trafficking cases by strengthening a multidisciplinary approach.

The Task Force has also been expanding a number of data collection and research initiatives to measure the impact of COVID-19 on human trafficking response efforts statewide. The State Task Force partnered with the University of South Carolina to develop a COVID-19 Survey for dissemination to service providers. The data is being collected and will be shared in the 2020 Annual Report.

Furthermore, the Task Force has begun meeting with key state agencies in order to grow South Carolina's capacity to collect human trafficking data elements across sectors. These meetings will continue throughout 2021. By improving human trafficking data collection, the Task Force

aims to better quantify the magnitude of this crime, improve the public's understanding of the issue, and combat the spread of misinformation online while also identifying gaps in much-needed victim services.

As National Human Trafficking
Awareness Month approaches, the State Task
Force is preparing for the release of its
legislatively mandated 2020 Annual Report.
Task Force members will receive
questionnaires designed to collect and
synthesize information on state and regional
anti-human trafficking efforts. The data
provided by the questionnaires will highlight
sector-specific efforts throughout South
Carolina. Key stakeholders who are partnered
with the Task Force will also have the
opportunity to submit goals for their antitrafficking efforts in the upcoming year.

We thank you for your continued efforts to combat human trafficking in South Carolina, especially in the midst of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. We look forward to continued collaboration with Task Force members throughout 2021. We wish you all a safe, happy holiday season!

October 28th marked the 20th anniversary of the TVPA, the groundbreaking federal legislation that established human trafficking as a crime in the U.S. The law has since been authorized in 2003, 2005, 2008, 2013, 2017, and 2018.
