Dear Mr. Speaker:

You have inquired as to whether Members of the House are required to demonstrate attendance at a meeting of the House before being eligible for the compensation that may be provided for Members.

It is my opinion that it is not necessary that attendance be shown as a prerequisite to receiving compensation, but that the General Assembly may require that attendance at meetings of extra sessions be certified before a Member shall be eligible for compensation for that day. It has not yet so provided.

The reasons and bases for the conclusions herein expressed are more extensively set forth in a memorandum which is attached hereto.
