Dear Ms. Smith:

Thank you for your letter of September 25 inquiring as to whether an eleemosynary organization may sue and may be sued.

Under the laws of this State, it is my opinion that an eleemosynary corporation may not be sued in tort, although it may be sued ex contractu. The South Carolina Council for Human Rights is an eleemosynary corporation which, under its chartered powers, can sue and be sued, but this does not, in my opinion, carry with it the right to be sued in tort.
