In your letter of December 28, 1971, you requested that we advise you as to the authority possessed by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission to deny a retail liquor license upon the ground that the location of the proposed outlet is unsuitable.

Section 4–33, South Carolina Code of Laws, provides in part a follows:

The Commission shall refuse to grant any license . . . if it shall be of the opinion that:

(2) The store or place of business to be occupied by the applicant is not a suitable place,
